

Human trafficking is a criminal offence. Victims have the right to receive support!

Have you been a victim of human trafficking for sexual exploitation / respectively forced prostitution?



You have come to Germany with the intent to work legally. Instead you have been forced into prostitution against your will.

- You have been threatened, beaten, locked up and controlled.
- You have been threatened with the infliction of harm upon your family.
- You have been forced to perform sexual acts.
- Your passport / ID card / residence permit / visa has been taken from you.
- You don't have any valid residence Permit, so your residence in Germany is illegal.
- You do not speak our language and feel like a stranger / isolated.
- You have been told that neither police nor other institutions can help you.
- You are afraid of deportation.
- You have been forced to hand in the money you have earned, e.g. to pay for debts or travel expenses.
- You have been prevented from stopping work as a prostitute.

What kind of assistance is available to you?



- You may be brought to a safe place, if required.
- You will receive support to secure your subsistence and medical health care.
- You will receive support in contacting authorities like e.g. the Foreign Office or the Federal Office for Migration and Refugees.
- We will support you, if you want to talk to lawyers, and we accompany you to court proceedings.
- We will help you to determine your residency status.
- We help you if you want to leave the country.

We speak several languages at our counselling centers, but if necessary, we will call in an interpreter.
